PE and Sport Premium Overview: 2022-23 & 2023-24

The school has continued to give a high priority to PE this year with continued provision of the Sport Premium. Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to schools, initially for two academic years (2013-14 & 2014-15) but which has since continued annually. The Sport Premium is to be used to 'Increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increasing participation in PE & Sport'.

This year the school received £17,200. This is calculated as a £16,000 baseline amount plus £10 per pupil (Years 1-6). Below is a record of the usage of the Sport Provision for the past academic year.
